Dear praying friend,

I wanted to give you an update on our move!

We have started renting another rental house, this one very close to the kids school, a couple weeks ahead of time. We are now moving things over there by our van, bit by bit, and next Tuesday we will have the big moving truck rented to handle our big stuff and furniture.
