Hello! I hope this letter finds you doing well and experiencing God's love each day.

I'm writing to you because I have some very exciting news! I will be going back to Japan this summer on a mission trip with Cru (formerly Campus Crusade for Christ) from May 21st to July 3rd. But before more of the trip details, let me bring you up to date about me and how God has led me to this point.

Last summer I went to Japan for about 3 weeks to help with tsunami relief work. It was quite an experience. I was overwhelmed by much of what I saw; the degree of damage is something that pictures, and even video, just cannot



capture in a way that being there does. During that time, God showed me my heart for the Japanese, and how, despite being American, when I walk out of the airport into Japan, I feel a little bit more at home.

After a busy three weeks, I came back to America with a sense of loss as to what I was supposed to do here in Orlando. I also became more involved with Cru at UCF, helping lead a community group, and helping set up and tear down for our weekly gatherings at UCF. The rest of my time goes to church, intramural sports, exercising at the gym, and spending time with friends and family.

Throughout the year, however, God never let me completely forget Japan, or my heart for the Japanese people, and I began feeling like this next summer might involve Japan again. Of course, that went against everything the school system was telling me, because it would mean giving up finding a "real" job right after graduating. However, the nagging feeling that I was called to Japan remained, so I began looking into summer projects, and after much prayer and thought, I signed up.



Unlike last summer, this summer I will be focusing on bringing Spiritual relief to the nation of Japan. Last year, while I was more than happy to help them re-start, I realized what they really needed was something most people couldn't give them, but I could. Despite all the progress rebuilding, they still needed a source of purpose and hope from it all. Last summer I went to show hope, physically, to the Japanese people; to show them that the world cares, and they are not alone. This summer I want to go to tell them that God cares, and He will never leave them or forsake them and that even when all the world fails, God won't.
